# Where Is Your Meeting? Is It Welcoming?

hen a newcomer or someone who is new to your meeting arrives at the location listed in the schedule, can they find your meeting? I have tried to go to meetings where there was no indication of which building or door to enter. Even if I find the right building, which room is it in? I went to one meeting where there was an AA meeting and church meetings going on. Where was the Al-Anon meeting?

#### SIGNS ARE WONDERFUL!

Some meetings have tent signs near the door and additional signs to guide a person to the correct room. The next time you go to your meeting, pretend you had never been there before. Could you find your meeting? Would you know you are in the right room?

As Lois W., one of the founders of Al-Anon, said, "Let us not mistake anonymity for secrecy." (*Lois Remembers* page 194 quoted in *Many Voices, One Journey* Page 205)

She also said, "[If] Al-Anon groups do not let the public know of our presence, ... we block ourselves off from those in need." (Lois Remembers page 194)

#### DOES YOUR GROUP HAVE A GREETER?

Is someone available at least 10 minutes early to greet people? I have gone to several meetings where no one arrived until 10 minutes AFTER the meeting was scheduled to start. If I were new, I would have been confused, given up, and left. How sad.

Al-Anon was there for me. I want to be sure it is there for the next person who needs it and I "Let It Begin With Me."

# Willingness leads to recovery

l-Anon gives me hope for a better day – each day I work my program. I recently celebrated my Al-Anon anniversary by saying yes to speak at the Sunday Night New Haven Al-Anon Meeting Anniversary. I could have mentioned the number of years I have been attending Al-Anon meetings, but, for me, it is more important to focus on how I am practicing my program today. After all, the only day my Higher Power has given me is today.

When I came to Al-Anon my life was a mess. I had a successful, secure career but I was suffering. My home life was full of turmoil and bitter resentment. My relationship with my children damaged, seemingly beyond repair. I was full of despair, angry, and hopeless. And God? Nowhere to be found.

Somehow I was given the gift of willingness – in a moment of sheer desperation – to go to an Al-Anon meeting. And that gift continued to nourish me as I put up my hand to do service at my second meeting. Thank you, Al-Anon, for coffee service! I felt like I belonged.

I kept saying yes. Yes to Programmer, to Group Representative, to District service. Each act of service had something to offer me. Each service position taught me something about myself. I was lovable, capable, I had abilities, I had something valuable to offer the group.

I got a sponsor who helped me understand what my part was in each of my family relationships — especially my part in my relationship with the alcoholic. I kept blaming everything on the alcoholic. Everything was her fault! Until my sponsor challenged me to consider that, just maybe, I had a part in the chaos. How about 5% he said? That was a start to healing me.

When my sponsor guided me to put the focus on myself, I started to see the changes that Al-Anon brought me. Through working the Steps, attending meetings and listening to others, through daily reading of literature I was changing how I saw me, my attitudes, my behavior, my motives.

But it was willingness to do service that gave me that perspective that there is a Power greater than myself working in my life and in the lives in my loved ones. And it was working the Steps and embracing humility that I became teachable. And you – dear Al-Anon folks – taught me.

I learned that when I can't feel a Higher Power in my life, I need to remember that it isn't God that has moved. Today I have a God of my understanding that I don't fully understand. And that understanding keeps evolving as I evolve in Al-Anon with the help of that Higher Power – who today I call God. I ask daily for knowledge of His will for me. Wow! I have gotten so many gifts in my life for following what He has guided me to. And when I doubt His existence, and I do sometimes doubt, I am reminded by Al-Anon to gently look back at the journey He has taken me on and see His presence in my life. And I see amazing abundance!

Today my relationships with my children is healing and I cherish every moment I spend with them and their families. Especially, I am grateful for my 4-year-old grandson. He has given me that

opportunity to be for my grandson what I could not be for my children when they were young. And those amends that I have and continue to practice with my grown children has nurtured a deeper love and acceptance within each relationship. And one of my children attends her own 12-Step program of recovery. For all Al-Anon has given me, I am so grateful today.

I have problems and challenges like everyone living their life on planet earth. My dear wife of 36 years is in poor health and I have retired from my career in part to be of help. Life provides me opportunities on a daily basis to work my program, to find a balance, to feel at peace with my life.

I read daily literature, I attend my meetings, I engage in service at my meetings and, for now, at the Area level. I talk to my sponsor and close Al-Anon friends and 'reason things out'. I love reaching out to newcomers to extend that hand of Al-Anon that was extended to me when I entered my first meeting long ago.
