Treasurers Report – Marcia M., Area Treasurer

Reserve Fund guidelines were reviewed, the current Reserve Fund balance is \$22,298.58 as of May 31, 2017. Interest on the Fund since its inception on 3/29/97 has been \$4,345.30.

There are 19 Alateen meetings in Connecticut. CAWW was held from May 19-21, 2017. 33 teens and 29 sponsors/AMIAS attended. This event returned \$2500 seed money to the Area. The 60th anniversary of Alateen will be celebrated on Oct. 15, 2017 at the Holy Spirit Church in Newington. Besides Facebook and Twitter, there is an Alateen chatroom for teen from 13 -18. Some group sponsors and AMIAS are reaching the end of their 6-yr. terms. Volunteers are appreciated.

He is newly elected; two board members have ended their terms of service; volunteers are needed to replace them.
