Thoughts on Crosstalk

The term “crosstalk” is not mentioned in our Conference Approved Literature (CAL). It has been the topic of *Forum* articles and has been brought up at the World Service Conference. But while it has caused concern for groups, Al-Anon apparently has no opinion on this subject and leaves it up to the autonomy of the groups. The term was probably brought into the groups from outside, possibly from therapy sessions or other Twelve Step programs.

A simple definition formulated at a workshop at the 1991 World Service Conference is “Crosstalk occurs when one member monopolizes the meeting with one-to-one responses to another member (advice-giving). This includes the chairperson who feels the need to comment on each sharing (coming off as an expert).” Other definitions include not using “I” statements, side conversations and mini-meetings within meetings. Most members agree these types of sharings are not in keeping with Al-Anon principles. (And by using “I” statements we don't mean “I think you should...” or “If I were you...”)

The Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (2010-13) says “No member of Al-Anon should ... give advice” (p.24) and “Experience suggests that ... all members have the opportunity to share.” (p.41) The Suggested Welcome refers to the “loving interchange of help among members.” (p.11)

Some people equate the give and take back and forth in a meeting as “loving interchange,” while many others call it “crosstalk.” It appears that early on there were fewer “rules” and if someone was hurting that person became the focus as others offered their experience, strength and hope.



There can be a loving interchange without losing the focus of the meeting. Sometimes, we can simply say that many of us have had similar experiences and that some of us would love to talk with the person afterwards.

Taking a Group Inventory (G-8) asks the somewhat rhetorical questions “Do I interrupt or carry on a conversation while another member is speaking?”, “Do I listen carefully to the speakers, the chairperson and other group members?”, “Do I avoid giving advice to members?” and “Are we easily diverted from the topic in order to focus on a member's problem?”

How Al-Anon Works (B-22) says that we share our “experience, strength and hope” (p. 11) but “In Al-Anon, we do not give advice.” (p. 16) “We talk about the problems we ourselves have encountered and how we have used the principles and practices of the Al-Anon program to help work through our problems. We share out feelings, our growth and our pain. We listen and we learn.” (p. 16)

To me, it is a matter of respect and courtesy for the other person, respect and courtesy I would wish for myself. Sometimes I just need to have my say without someone trying to “fix” me. Often when I am allowed to explain how I feel I discover my own solutions.

If a member does what I consider “crosstalk,” I can gently suggest that it is inappropriate or gently explain this during a break or after the meeting. I do NOT want to jump on or embarrass the person. I usually give a little more leeway to newcomers who often learn what is appropriate from how I behave. It is cruel to cut someone off and say we can't respond to their questions.

If we follow the spirit of the Traditions and Slogans at our meetings, we should not have problems with “crosstalk” because “Our common welfare should come first” (Tradition 1) and “Easy Does It.”
